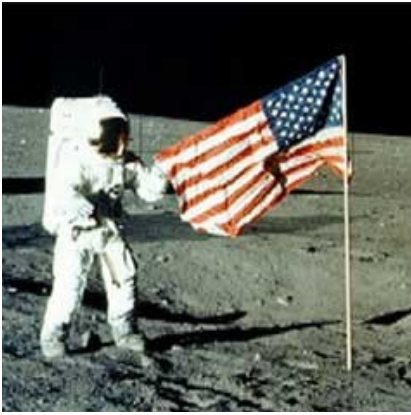

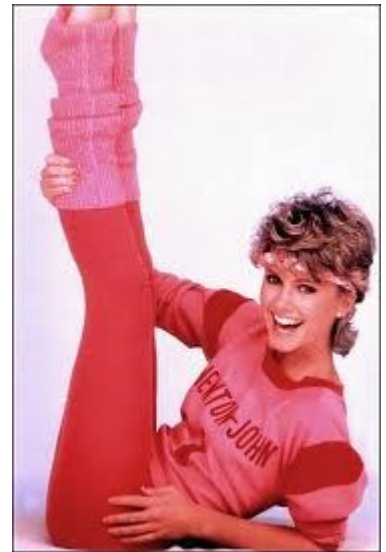








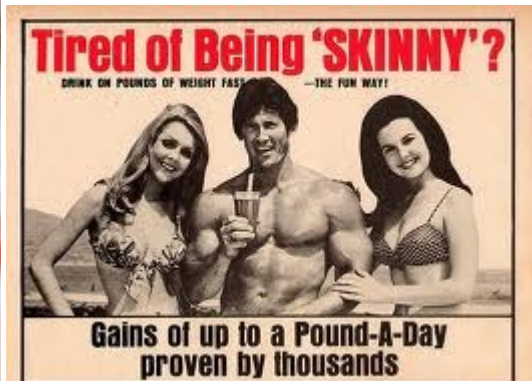
- In 1980 a gallon of gas was \$1.19 and by 1989 was 97 cents
